In the name of God Amen: I John Howe of Fleming County State of Kentucky do this 14th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred seventeen make for this my last will and testament in manner & form following: I first will that all my English debts be paid out of my personal estate also I will to my beloved wife Rebecca Howe the interest of the money due me by note of hand or account of it as may be necessary for her support during life also the usufruct with all the articles therein contained during life also her bed and furniture during life as also a necessary part of the household furniture for her use and benefit also to be supported on or by the premises when I am alive during life also I will to my beloved wife the black man and also and ^{for her use & benefit} until her death I will her to serve Washington Howe also will that at my beloved wife's death the money due to me by notes of hand be equally divided among my sons & daughters viz Joseph Saml John William ~~the same~~ to be paid them. note I have here a quantity of land

note I received from him on John Ruth and that note shall pass to be his part of my estate also I will to my son David Howe also I will to my three equal shares of the money due to me also I will to his wife Sarah Howe one hundred Dollars to make one cloth during life also I will to my son David Howe one hundred acres of land in the plantation of mine two or being bought from Michael Capidy for his use and bought also I will to my son James and Thomas three equal shares also I will to my daughter Mary McAdams and Jan Howe & Sarah Howe three equal shares also I will to my son Washington Howe the plantation I live on containing one hundred acres with all the plantation implements such as plow iron axes hoe mattock wedges &c. also I will to my beloved wife her choice of two of the milk cows and son Washington the other two also I will that a Mr Robert Anderson son Joseph and son David Howe be my executors in trust of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first above written signed sealed and acknowledged in presence of us who were present at the signing and sealing thereof
