Elizabeth Bartoo Lewis Loyd Simon Loyd Julia Rutha Lemuel Loyd Elizabeth Bartoo has received forty dollars of her part Lewis Loyd has received three hundred dollars of his part Simon Loyd has received one hundred dollars of his part Julia Rutha has received one hundred dollars of her part and as for my son Andrew Loyd I leave one dollar for he has received his full part of my estate & as to my daughter Elizabeth Bartoo I wish to leave in the hands of the admin to buy her a piece of land during life & after her death to be the aim of her body forever and as for my son Lemuel Loyd I wish to have this my land by his paying & three hundred and nine dollars to be taken out of his part in the interest and the money that my children has received is not to carry interest & lastly I appoint my wife Sarah Loyd and my son Andrew Loyd and my son Lemuel Loyd administrators of this my last will & Testament I do witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 3rd of December Eighteen hundred & sixteen

paid to be his part of my estate also I will to my son David
three also three to my son equal dividend of the money

son David two one hundred acres of land the place ^{known} as
two ~~in~~ being bought from Michael Murphy for his use and
benefit also I will to my son James and Thomas three equal
dividend also I will to my ~~daughter~~ Mary McAdow
and Jane Hows & Isabel Evans three equal dividend also
I will to my son Washington three the plantation I live on
on containing one hundred acres with all the plantation
implements such as plow iron and hoes mattock
