In the Court of Lord Amos I James Dale of Kentucky being weak of body but of sound and perfect mind and memory do hereby certify for the same to make and to make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following viz.

First, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Abigail Dale her full share of the personal estate for movable forever and the third of the profits of the said estate during her natural life or widowhood

Secondly, I do give and bequeath to my grand Daughter Sally Daughter to say the sum of fifty Dollars at my Death and the money to be put to interest ~~until~~ until she arrives at the age of Eighteen years but if said Sally should not live to above age or have any lawful issue then the said money is to belong to her mother

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sally one bed and Bedding being the same which now goes by her name

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to John Taylor my stepson fifty acres of land off the plantation or land where I now live and is laid off for me to him his heirs and assigns

And I give I give I give and bequeath to my son John Dale the remaining part of my Plantation consisting of one hundred and sixty acres with all the improvements thereon to him the said John Dale his Executors and administrators forever

And Lastly the remaining two thirds of real estate or personal estate I give and bequeath as follows, To George William Arney Esq and Sarah Taylor and to John Dale and Jane Dale Esq there and Jane Dale and Sarah Taylor appoint George Taylor sole executor of this my last will and Testament thereby revoking all former wills by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twentieth Day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen
