of Blount County State of Georgia being
in a low state of health but perfectly in
my mind make this my last will testament
revokeing all others. First I recommend my soul
to its mother earth and my soul to God who
gave it also my worldly goods I dispose of
in the following manner to wit. My will is that
all my debts which are but few first be paid
Second my will is that my beloved wife Margaret
have all my personal property to dispose of as
she may see proper ^{for the maintenance of my children and to provide for her} ~~she may see proper~~ ^{relieving her natural life}
and if there should be any personal property at her
death not disposed of by her to be equally divided
between all my children Third it is my will
that at the death of my beloved wife that
my land be equally divided between my
four sons viz James, Aaron, Isaac & John
Fourth it is my will that all my money
which is loaned out or may be hereafter de-
bited be equally divided between all my children
or so much as can or may be collected Also
leave my old black woman free at my death
if she sees proper to leave the family. as it
respect the money before mentioned there is
about six hundred dollars in the hands of
Stockton & Alexander, about one hundred & twenty in
the hands of Isaac & Keith about forty nine
dollars in the hands of John & Lee, in the hands
of Dorsey Stockton one hundred dollars in the
hands of Moses Bridges fifty five dollars also

in the hands of James Eckels two hundred & 365
twenty dollars John Decker one hundred & thirty
five also what is on hand it is also my will
that my son James and my wife be my executors
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
seal in the presence of

At a court held for Blount County on the 6th of
November 1846. This writing purporting to be the
last will testament of Aaron Nungund was
produced in court proved by the oaths
of Joseph Secrest John Keith the witnesses
therein ordered to be recorded which is done
at Ashland Georgia 1846

to make distribution of the personal estate and
to adjust the advancement, have performed that
duty as follows. It appears that the following
advancements in personal property have been
made by James Patton dec'd to his several children
as charged by himself viz. To Mary Patton the sum of \$200.00

Total advancements	\$1033.12

we find the first four distributees have received over
& above their distributable share there remaining
in the hands of adm^r upon settlement of his
accounts the sum of \$241.17. from which take 3.25.

366. the cost this settlement leaves \$2378.25 of which
 the widow is entitled to one third say \$792.75
 which leaves for distribution to John James Pelton
 the sum of \$1585.50
 which add John's advancement 150.25
 James, wife 50.00
 one half of which \$348.25

 The administrator is therefore to pay to John 36.15
 and to James 124.50
 To make them equal all \$158.50
 which is submitted Sept 8th 1826.

 directing the undersigned to make partition of
 ten slaves among the children of James McComen
 dec'd being a portion of the slaves allotted to
 Susanah McComen as her dower and which she
 now relinquishes and requests partition to be made
 we proceeded to divide them into five lots &
 then allotted them as follows viz Lockancy
 Strodes trustee for her use negro woman & daughter
 small negro boy molly value 100.00.

To Harry McComen negro girl named Eliza value 175
 negro boy named Henry " 200.00
 Abram McComen negro girl named Annada value 150.00
 negro boy named Frank " 225.00

To Isaac L. McComen negro boy & daughter value 150.00
 negro girl named Mary 225.00
 To Johnston McComen negro girl named Malinda value 200.00
 negro boy Perry 170.00
 making in the whole \$1895.00

and we find each one's share is 379.00 there fore
 Nancy Strodes share hath to pay to Harry Abraham
 & James each \$4. Johnson \$7. to make each one
 even given under our hands the 25th Sept in the
 year 1826.
