body to the earth and whithersoever taken in full
assurance of its resurrection from thence at the last
day as for my burial I leave it my family
as to my worldly Estate and the land that I now
hold it shall be given to my dear Wife too as
for Samuel as he has had a part of my place the
two years for which he hath been made me any
compensation but therefore either to pay at the rate
of ten pounds per year to James or John or pay them
the hundred pounds that he bargained with me
for said land to be paid equally between James
and John when called upon and to Andrew the part
of the place that I now live on shall be his for
which he shall maintain his mother during her
life and she shall have all the personal property
in the house and one horse and cows kept to her
while she lives and there is a cow to be given to her
in cash or stock to Sally Ramsey Roxana
Ramsay and Sally's child and to my dear
daughter Keiza she shall have one bed and
clothes sufficient with one bow if she behave and
marries according to consent she shall have one
side saddle the girls is to be paid jointly by the
boys as they shall agree the the old woman
shall have the disposal of her property at her
own as she thinks proper at her last
