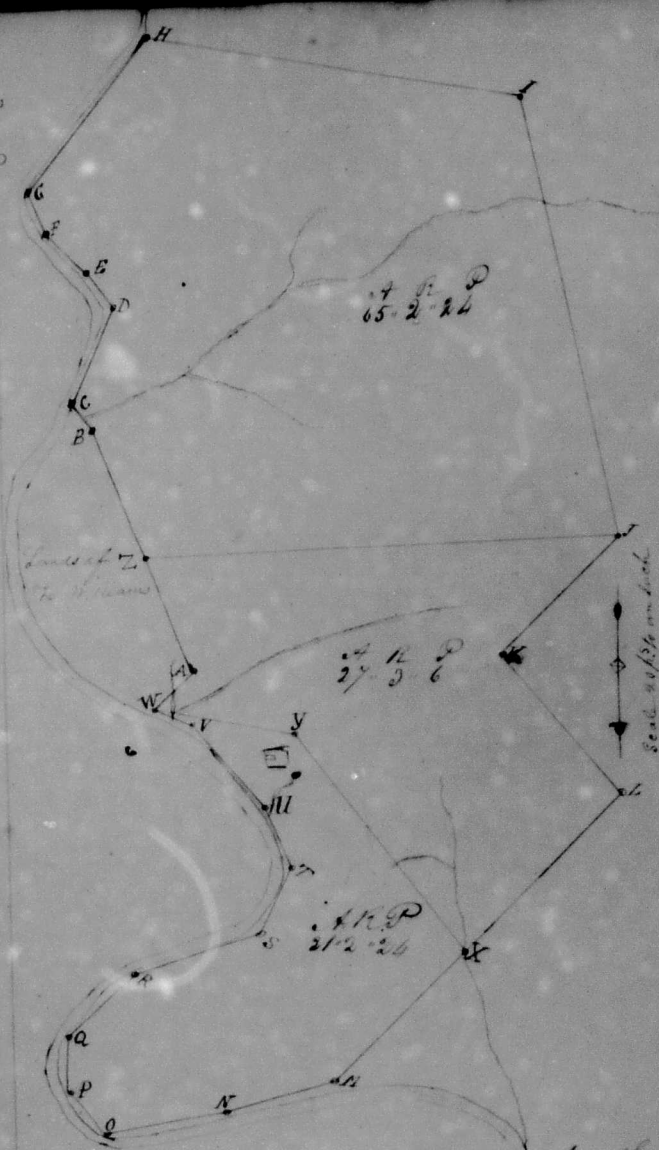




Agreeable to an order of the Honorable the Court
of Chancery made at their last July Term
appointing us whose names are annexed commissioners
to divide the real estate of Ellen Vinson deceased
the widow and heirs of said deceased as the said com-
missioners found the real estate to consist of one hundred &
fourteen acres of land lying on the North Fork of
Licking which is included in the following boundary tract.

Beginning at a dead white oak marked A on the corner of
Hall thence South 22 degrees East 50 poles to B a buckeye and
an hickory thence South 50 degrees East 50 poles to C a
buckeye on the bank of the North Fork thence up with
the meanders of said creek South 24 degrees East 22 1/4 Poles
to D thence South S 36° East 10 poles to E thence South 45
degrees East 12 poles to F thence South 26° E. 10 poles to G thence
South 27° West 42 poles to H an Elm on the Bank of
the creek thence N. 80° W. 92 poles to I two white oaks thence
N. 19 degrees West 98 poles to J two white oaks thence North
45° E. 36 poles to K a maple corner to S Hinton's Survey
thence North 40 degrees West 40 poles to L a stake in Hinton's
Survey thence North 45 degrees East 89 poles to M a sugar-bow
standing on the North Fork thence up the North Fork
with the several meanders thereof North 75 degrees East 24
poles to N thence North 30 degrees East twenty 1/2 poles
to O thence South 40 degrees East 12 poles to P thence South
12 poles to Q thence South 45 degrees West 20 poles to R thence
South 73 degrees West twenty eight poles to S thence South
26 degrees West 16 poles to T thence South 23 degrees East 14
poles to U thence South 40 degrees East 24 poles to V thence South
59 degrees East 8 poles to W a black walnut thence South
45 degrees West 14 poles to the Beginning.

That part of the above described tract of land lying within
the following boundary tract, Beginning at N. the black walnut
corner in the above survey thence North 80° West 92 poles to S situated
at the Stables including the same thence North 37 1/2 degrees
West 60 poles to X an oak stump (near the area) standing in the
line of the above survey thence with said line North 40 degrees East
10 1/2 poles to M the sugar-bow on the creek thence up the same
with the boundary as described in the above survey to W the Beginning
containing twenty one acres, two Rods, twenty four poles the affix
to
Vinson widow and relict of Ellen Vinson dec'd for an
as her share being the one third part in value of the above one
hundred and fourteen acres. There are eight children heirs of the
Estate of Ellen Vinson dec'd but Charles having predeceased to us Bonds
for a little from four of the heirs for their respective distributive portions
of the said one hundred and fourteen acres of land his sons distributive
portions making five and Thomas having predeceased to us Bonds
on two of the remaining heirs for the convenience of them

Respective parts, his and her making three in her whole
 inside the whole tract into two parts by the division line
 Beginning at 1 two white oaks, thence a North 88 degrees
 East 78 poles to a white oak standing in the line from A
 a dead white oak to B a Buckeye and her hickories 32
 poles from B the south end of said tract of the south
 containing five undivided shares, the north end containing
 three undivided shares subject to the widow's consent
 which being done the division line was a grid upon by
 the said Charles Vinson and Thomas Vinson and the south
 end of said tract of land from the division line shown
 at the request of the said Charles & Thomas as appears
 also to be Charles and that part of the tract by
 a North of the division line by the consent and request
 of the said Charles & Thomas, as appears and that
 Thomas subject to the power of the widow as aforesaid
 the number of acres south of the division line is six
 free but Rodd's and nearly four poles the number of acres
 lying north of the division line is forty more or less Rodd
 and thirty poles
