

I, George Lutton, of Fleming County, and State of Kentucky, make this my last will & testament, that is to say I will my wife, both real and personal, to do with as she, in her wisdom, may think proper for herself, and my little children, and if she should ever marry again, my will is, that one third of my estate shall be hers that is my wife, and the balance to be sold, and equally divided amongst my children. Furthermore my will is, that if God should in his wisdom remove my wife from time to eternity, I make Samuel Howard my sole executor, and that he in this case shall by my authority, sell all my estate, and that the proceeds shall be equally divided amongst my children as they become of age: And if my wife should live, I wish her to sell my land, and purchase a small piece somewhere that will suit her better.
