 dollars (and a part of which \$4000 I have taken the
 steps necessary to place in said Tilford hands) and
 at the expiration of said partnership (my son George
 Ann) to be an assistant without any stipulation
 upon what terms) after each withdrawing the
 sum by him advanced the profits to be equally
 divided between us now it is my will & desire
 that my Executor hereafter named go on to
 complete said contract for the partnership if
 said Tilford requires it to continue till my youngest
 son (George Ann) arrives to the age of twenty one
 years Item My will & desire is that the partnership
 now existing between William Bott & myself

 twenty one years he be entitled to one half
 of my estate and my son George and the other
 half when he also arrives at the age of
 twenty one years and I hereby appoint my
 Brother Seth Botts Executor of this my last
 will & testament Given under my hand & seal

40 per cent. of which stock had been drawn by the dec^d in his life time as is believed, the 6th Bank Book of the dec^d shows a balance due him of \$1968. from the Lexington Branch bank - the U.S. Bank book of the dec^d shows a balance due him of \$300 from the Lexington Branch Bank. William Bots reports that there was left by the dec^d in the desk of Geo. W. Mott \$1100 in specie bank notes, after he had applied what was necessary for burial expences, Doctor Bells, & advance, necessary for his sons, & settled some other accounts. There is also some small debt for negro hire &c. the amt. unknown to the adm^r, nor who owes them with certainty.
