request that my truly friend William Kennan will
assist with my beloved wife in the execution of this
my last will and Testament, and it is my wish that
my beloved wife Polly Saunders may not be requir-
ed to give security as Executrix hereof unless she should
so long when it is my request that she may be com-
pelled to give ample security. Nothing in this my last
will and Testament shall be so construed as to deprive
my wife of her absolute right to the full enjoyment
of my whole estate during her widowhood and in case
of her marriage to the third part thereof during

her natural life, except such part thereof as I have (23)
already given both Real and personal to my beloved Daughter

The writing purporting to be the last will & testament of a deceased

In the name of God Amen! I Henry Hurst of the County of Fleming and in the State of Kentucky being near
in a violent attack of second wind and memory, Depose that on
the fifth day of January in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and thirteen make this my last will
and Testament in manner following that is to say first I give
to my well beloved wife Ann Hurst my bed Bed and furniture
her chair of a bow and her chest & give and bequeath to my
son Zuleing after the death of my wife Ann all of my
Real Estate (that is to say) all the Land I now possess &
the appurtenances thereto, and it is my will that my son Zuleing
occupy the Land and support his mother during her natural
life, or pay her forty dollars per year and at her death with any
of her children whom she pleases, and it is my will, and I
do order that in three years after the death of my wife
Ann that my son Zuleing pay to the rest of my children
himself after named the sum of two hundred dollars to be
equally divided as amongst them share & share alike and it
is my will that all my personal or moveable property be
equally divided as follows (that is to say) between my son Henry
Hurst and my son Sandy Hurst and my son John Hurst.

and the heirs of my son Henry Hunt deceased
and to my Daughter Sarah Gardner and my son
William Hunt and my daughters & my husband
and my Daughter Mary Gardner share & share alike
and it is my will if my wife live longer than
