In the name of God, Amen I James Quinn of Fleming County and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of a sound and perfect mind and perfect memory blessed be the Almighty God for it do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner as follows, that is to say first after my funeral expenses & just debts are paid and discharged, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anna one third of my Estate and the two thirds of my Estate I leave the same to my four teen children and grandson Isaiah to be divided share and share alike between them paying due respect to the different sums I have paid to the children that is married. It is my will that the plantation I now live on be sold after my decease and the payment to be made in three annual instalments, and as the instalments as they become due to be equally divided amongst the legatees, all I have at the discretion of my Executors, whom I appoint and nominate namely my sons James, and James Young shall be my Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of January 1824.
