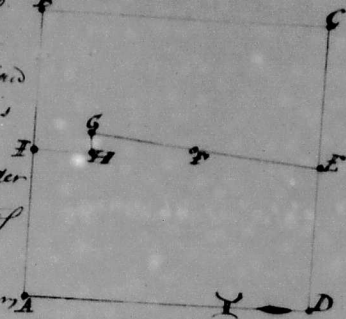

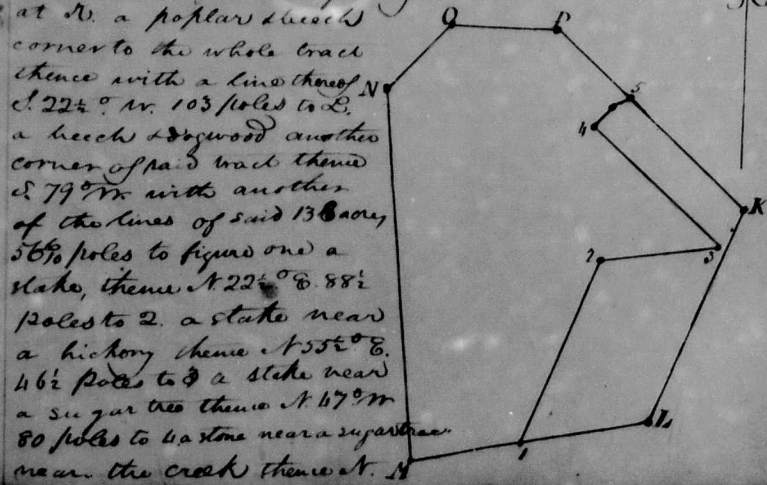

At the request of
George Bishop Esq. and
for the heirs of James
McKinney dec'd. and
pursuance of an order
of the County Court of
Fleming a planting
as the undersubscribers



Commissioners to lay off to said McKinney
widow of said James McKinney and her dower
in the lands he died seized & possessed of and
first ascertained that he was possessed of three
tracts of land in the County of Fleming and
being first sworn to allot to the said widow
McKinney the one third of the land & profits
of said three tracts which the annexed plat
& report will explain. A.B. 6. Representing
100 acres of land from a deed from James
Richard to John Beckner exchanged by
said Beckner to said James McKinney & on
other lands on the East of said 100 acres
adjoins 38 acres that said McKinney held by
bond from John Chambers the one third
of said two tracts are allotted to the widow
which is bounded as follows beginning at
B. a black walnut & along the S.E. corner
of said 100 acres thence N. with a line of
the same 126¹/₂ poles to C. a hickory & dogwood
another of the corners of said 100 acres thence
S. with another of the line thereof 62 poles to E.
a stone in the land between John Jackson's
& McKinney's farms thence S. 4¹/₂ N. 22 poles to F.

a stone at the angle of the land through b (32)
McKinney's farm thence S. 7¹/₂ N. with the land
46¹/₂ poles to G. a white oak & dogwood at the
end of the line thence S. 9 poles to H. a stake
thence S. 25 poles to I. a stake in the S. boundary
of 100 acres from Richard thence west with the
same 161 poles to the Beginning containing 46
acres including the mansion house, stable and
out houses & 16 acres 26 poles of the cleared land
on said two tracts leaving the line of the fence
that make the East boundary of the land that
runs northwardly & southwardly through the farm
to the remainder of said two tracts & not to the
widow's dower. We then allotted to the said
McKinney the one third of the land & profits of
one other tract of land situated on Fleming
creek containing 138 acres 26 poles & conveyed to
James McKinney by Alexander James & David
McAlexander & represented on the annexed plat
by the lines & letters A. B. C. D. E. F. G. H. I. J. K. L. M. N. O. P. Q. R. S. T. U. V. W. X. Y. Z. & that part of
which we allotted a widow
is bounded as follows Beginning
at A. a poplar & hickory
corner to the whole tract
thence with a line thereof N.
S. 22¹/₂ N. 103 poles to B.
a hickory & dogwood another
corner of said tract thence
S. 79¹/₂ N. with another
of the lines of said 138 acres
56¹/₂ poles to figure one a
stake thence N. 22¹/₂ S. 88¹/₂
poles to 2. a stake near
a hickory thence N. 55¹/₂ S.
46¹/₂ poles to 3. a stake near
a sugar tree thence N. 47¹/₂ N.
80 poles to 4. a stone near a sugar tree
near the creek thence N. 11
