will for all men once to die, do make ordain and establish this
Cassam. as my last will and Testament. First it is my desire to be
buried in a Christianlike manner at the discretion of
my Executors hereafter named. It is my will and desire
that all my just debts be paid. It is also my will and
desire, that my Executors hereafter named upon my death
to sell whatever personal Estate I may then be possessed of
including my Slaves if I own any at my death
at such a credit as they may think best, and after
my just debts, and the expenses attending the admin-
istration be paid, It is my will that my Executors pay
over to my beloved wife Elizabeth one third of the balance
and in their hands, she to have and enjoy the same to
her, her heirs and assigns forever and the balance
or remaining two thirds, I will and bequeath the same
to my son William Edgar Walker to him his heirs and
assigns forever. And whereas I hold one seventh of a
tract of land I now live on by descent from my Father
and I have purchased William Baleson and James Little
the respective shares which descended in like manner
to their wives my sisters; being in all I claim three eighths,
of the whole tract being about two hundred and eighty five
acres and it is the same my Father purchased of
Mr. Bodley. Now it is my will and desire that my Executors
and herein after named or the survivor of them shall sell
and convey my Interest in said tract whenever to them
it shall seem meet and at such credit as they may
think best and to convey the same in fee simple to the
purchaser, and that they in like manner pay over to

my wife Elizabeth upon her relinquishment of her own
one equal third of the real amount of said sale, and the
remaining two thirds to my son William Edgar Walker,
to have and to hold the same to them their heirs and assigns
forever and whereas I claim title by deed to one hundred
acres of land in the claim of John Bacon of one thousand
two hundred acres in this County. It is my will and desire that
my wife have the Rent of said Place for the space of
twelve years after my death and out of that she is to receive
that is to feed and clothe my son during that time, and after
that period It is my will and desire that my son, William Walker,
have the same in fee simple. And whereas if it shall please
God to call me hence shortly my son will be an infant
of tender years without a Father to superintend his Education
this trust I confide to my Executors or well as a contractor
his person and as a Fund for this purpose it is my wish
that they from time to time loan out his share of money
heretofore directed to be paid to him and the Interest accruing
thereon is to be credited as a Fund for that purpose not
wishing to touch the principle hereby devised to him and that
they apply the Fund for Education as to them may seem meet
the Rent of the Plantation I own in Tennessee until
my son shall arrive at age and after the term given
his mother is also to be applied by my Executors in his Edu-
cation if to them it may seem proper. Lastly I nominate
constitute and appoint my Brother Henry Walker and William
D. Fleming my sole Executors of this my last will and Testament
and in case of the death of either the survivor is hereby
vested with all the power that both would have were they
living and acting. In Testimony whereof I have to these
presently set my hand and affixed my seal to the same this
fifteenth day of February in the year eighteen hundred and thirty

God that the same be known that it is my will and desire that
it have an equal half of the estate hereafter will

there alike and it is my will that my Executors superintend
its Education in the same way in every particular as
directed in my son William's will & I also wish
my Executors or the survivor in case it should be thought
best by them and a fair price can be had to sell and
convey the one hundred acres of Land I claim in
Covins trail, and the money earned out at interest
and in case of sale they may pay to my wife
the interest for twelve years towards supporting my
two children after that period for the ^{use} of my children
