above named I also leave to my granddaughter

bonds executed to me by Triplett & Early toward
one for seven hundred dollars, and one for two
hundred with the Interest now accrued & that
may hereafter accrue until paid, I also leave
to Abraham Clarke one hundred dollars & to
Margaret Chibbey I leave two hundred dollars
all ^{my} papers relative to my Town property
in Saint Louis State of Missouri It is my
will that they be placed in the hands of
David R. Finley to make what use of them
his discretion may direct In witness of the
above being my last Will and testament I
do appoint my Friends James Young Esq. and
George Stewart Esq. of Pittsburgh, Alleghany and
Pennsylvania and William P. Fleming of Fleming
County Kentucky Executors, to see the same
duly fulfilled & executed - Witness my hand &
seal this fifth day of April in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty
four.
