In the name of God Amen I Joshua Stockton of the County of Fleming and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows, and first my will is that my six children that now live with me viz James John Samuel Sally Martha and Nancy continue to live on the place in a family capacity until separated by marriage or otherwise and my will is that all my moveable estate remain with them for their use and benefit And my plantation I give and bequeath to my three sons above named, and when the youngest arrives to twenty one years of age either of them may keep the land by paying the others their equal portion of the value of the land or they may sell it and divide the money arising from the sale thereof equally between the three And the day when Samuel arrives to the age of sixteen or eighteen years if my Executors to be hereafter named, should think it advisable to see they may place him with some good tradesman in order to learn a trade when he arrives at twenty one years of age the other two

to pay him the sum of fifty dollars but if I should not be thought advisable to put him to a trade then he is to take his part in the land as described above and in case either of the boys should die before they arrive at twenty years of age the other brothers shall have their share equally divided between them I bequeath to my two daughters Ruthy Bartow and Elizabeth Young the sum of five dollars each to be paid to them out of my estate in one year after my decease in to what they have already out of my estate And lastly I constitute and appoint my friend Joseph McKee and James McKee Executors of this my last will and testament in confirmation whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty second day of November 1824
