William Bots reports that there was left by the dec^d in the desk of Geo. W. Mott \$1100 in specie bank notes, after he had applied what was necessary for burial expences, Doctor Bells, & advance, necessary for his sons, settled some other accounts. There is also some small debt for negro hire &c the amt unknown to the adm^r, nor who owes them with certainty.

In the name of God, Amen: I Joseph Emmord of the County of Fleming State of Kentucky being of perfect mind & memory & well knowing the uncertainty of this mortal life do make this my last will & testament. First I commend my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth from whence it came, in a decent Christian like manner as to my estate with which God has been pleased to bless me it is my will that it shall be distributed

in the following manner viz, First, I give and bequeath unto my son William Emmons two hundred acres of the land on which I now live on the south side thereof to be divided by a straight line beginning at Locust Creek at the mouth of a small branch that puts into it in the lower verge of the meadow, and running in such direction as to include the quantity aforesaid by running across the tract to the back line including the houses & appurtenances
 Second It is my will that the land remaining after William 200 acres are taken off be equally divided amongst my children viz, Elijah William Katharine Anne Polly James, & Elizabeth in the following manner William to have his dividend run off adjoining his own 200 acres Katharine to have her share and Anne of which I make her heir) run off along side of William's the remainder to be sold & the money to be equally divided amongst Elijah Polly James children & Elizabeth's children
 Third I give and bequeath unto my son William one negro girl behind viz Melly Ann likewise I will that if my son William should die before his wife then usely & her increase shall belong to William's children
 Fourth I give & bequeath to my daughter Katharine one negro girl viz Eliza, I likewise give unto my daughter Katharine one horse beast to be chosen by her. Fifth I give & bequeath unto my daughter Polly Drake one negro girl viz Matilda during her life but if she should die before her husband, then he shall retain

said negro during his life, after his death 439 I wish her to return to my heirs Sixth I give and bequeath unto my grandchildren viz, Cadmuel Garrett - Gamaliel Freeman one negro man viz Reuben to be sold and the money equally divided amongst them. Seventh I give & bequeath unto my son Elijah one mulatto man viz James during his life only then to return to the estate. And as to the residue of my property not herein mentioned I wish it to be sold on a credit of twelve months and when the money is collected, it is my will that after my debts be paid the remainder of the money be equally divided among my children viz: Elijah William Katharine Polly James, & Elizabeth; James and Elizabeth's children to have their parents shares I also will that my negro boy Tom be sold & the money equally divided amongst my son James children It is also my will that if I die after the crop is put in, or in cropping time no division shall be made until the crop is gathered and then to be divided equally between my son William and my daughter Katharine lastly I appoint my son William Emmons and my grandson Garrett Freeman Executors to this my last will & testament hereby revoking all former wills by me heretofore made & resigning myself to the righteous will of Almighty God In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand & affix my seal this fourteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven
