In the name of God Amen I Philip Hendricks being
of a weak and infirm state of Body but of sound
mind, and considering the uncertainty of life, do make
and ordain this my last will and Testament in follow-
ing manner: viz. First I bequeath my soul to God who
gave it, and my Body to the dust from whence it came
secondly, I desire that all my just and lawful debts be
paid out of the first money that is raised or collected, Thirdly
I desire that all property money &c. of every descrip-
tion after such just and lawful debts be paid be left in
the hands and possession of my beloved wife Susan Hendricks
until her death. Fourthly after the decease of said Susan
Hendricks I bequeath my Plantation to my two youngest
sons Philip and William to be equally divided between them
Fifthly I will and bequeath that all my personal Prop-
erty of every description be equally divided share & share
about among the rest of my children. Sixthly & Lastly
I appoint and ordain Jesse DeLong my sole and only
Executor of this my last will and Testament.
