I, Elisha Carpenter, of the County of Fleming and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of man and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to make this my last will and testament. In the first place I resign my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the dust to be buried by my Executor herein after mentioned in a decent and Christian like manner, and as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon me which disposed of in the following manner I am first it is my will and desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid I am I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife the whole of my estate both real and personal to hold the same during her natural life, and at her death it is my will and desire that my real estate be divided in the following manner. I will and bequeath unto my son

9 Edward Darsey between four & five acres of ground  
being situate in the North East corner of the tract  
I now live on and which I have heretofore con-  
veyed to him and which he has now enclosed, and the  
balance of the tract upon which I now reside I  
will and bequeath unto my two sons namely John  
Darsey and Joshua Darsey to be divided by line running  
due north and South through the middle of the  
tract and the Western half to belong to my son John &  
the Eastern half to my son Joshua, and whereas it is  
my wish that each have a spring on their part  
if the land and if it should be found upon running  
the dividing line between them that the Spring it or  
near the still house should fall on the South half  
I wish to John that then I give and it is my will  
that Joshua shall have the spring and five acres of  
land to be laid off adjoining his half to include it  
and that John shall have five acres of his half  
to be laid off adjoining his half South of the Spring  
the full length of the line from the Spring to the  
Southern boundary of the tract and it is my will  
and desire that Joseph I Darsey have the tract  
of 100 acres which was this day conveyed to me by  
my son John being the same he purchased of

or otherwise he should become disabled or unable to support  
himself that then my sons John Joshua & Joseph I  
shall give to him a comfortable support, and lastly what  
personal property that may remain after the death  
of my wife in case she outlives me for all my death  
I give I own the long & short) It is my will and desire  
that it shall be equally divided amongst all my children  
share and share alike, except that my daughter Rachel  
shall be charged for one on account of her share of  
the personal property with the sum of one hundred & thirty  
five dollars and my daughter Sarah with the sum of two  
hundred dollars for advancements made by me to them, and  
whatever advancements I may hereafter make during my  
life shall also be charged to the one advanced, to be accounted  
for by them in receiving their share of the personal estate  
provided also that this does not be charged herein made  
of the personal property in no wise to effect the specific  
legacies to my three Daughters, and lastly I do hereby constitute  
my son John my sole executor to this my last will and  
Testament, hereby revoking all other former will, gifts, Testaments
