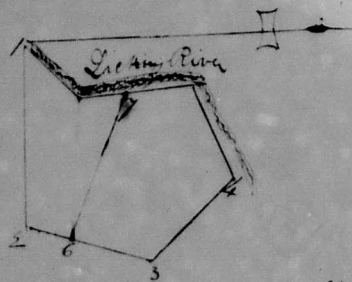


Figure 12394 and the meanders of Licking River represent the
