I now possess nearly east the line between 487
 along in 1827 by the name of ^{the} John C. Mills.
 Secondly, I bequeath to my son David Mills all the land
 I may be possessed of lying on the south side of the
 aforesaid branch and that only; and it is to be plain-
 ly understood that the branch above mentioned is to
 be considered the line between the land bequeathed
 above to my wife Margaret & the land bequeathed
 to my son David Mills and it is further to be under-
 stood that each is to have equal provision of the of the
 above mentioned branch for stock raised & gathered
 every year. It is probable that I may be
 something in debt. in such case my will is that my
 wife Margaret & my son David Mills, pay equal part
 of said debt that I may be owing at my death, in
 proportion to the quantity of land bequeathed to each
 as above described. Further, I bequeath to my wife Mar-
 garet all my other stock, &c. &c. & all my other
 personal property to dispose of as she may think proper but further
 it is to be understood that my wife is only to hold
 the land bequeathed to her so long as she may remain
 single or in case she should marry, my will is that her
