of a tract of land conveyed to me by Soling Ewing as
Sheriff of Logan County then if she should ^{at my death} ~~marry~~
the land to be sold as my other property and if she should
remain unmarried then she is to continue on said land
during her natural life the land to be bounded as follows
beginning at the South West corner of said tract which
-ch starts not far from Timothy Gons spring and running
with the same line of said tract until it crosses the road
leading from said Nancy Hopkins to the Bridge over
Whippoorwill creek on the road leading from Russellville
to Hopkinsville thence such a course as to strike where
the Westpaster fence and the old field joins and
with the adjoining fence till near the far end of that
