share and share alike. I do hereby nominate
and appoint my son John Hineman and
Isaac Keith and my beloved wife Jane Hineman
Executors & executrix of this my last will
& Testament. hereby revoking all former wills
by me made in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal this 11th day of
April in the year of our Lord 1827.
