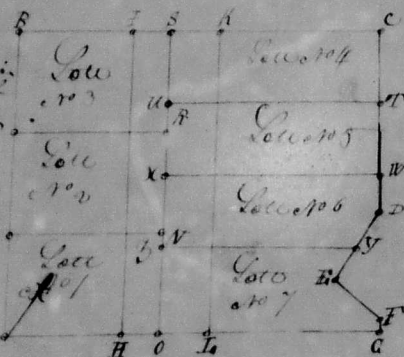

In presence of an order of Court appointing as the undersigned commissioners to divide the lands of the late Thomson Tarron between his widow and his one proceeded on the 18th October 1822 to make said division and divided a lot that fell to the late Thomson Tarron on a division

of the lands of the heirs of Joseph Tarron deceased and is a part of 550 acre tract patented to the heirs of Joseph Tarron situate in Fleming County on Tarrons Creek and by said division contain 202 1/2 acres and is represented in the foregoing plat by the drawn lines from A to B C D E F G and to A we first laid off to Henryalla Tarron widow of said Thomson Tarron fifty acres which in our opinion include the one equal third of the profits or advantages of said 202 1/2 acres and is bounded as follows Beginning at A a stake and two ash trees in the south boundary of said 550 acres thence north 35 West 166 1/2 poles to I an ash and four sugarrees in a line of said 202 1/2 thence with the same north 52 1/2 East 48 1/2 poles to K a stake near a sugarree and elm thence S 35 E 166 1/2 poles to L three Buckies thence S 52 1/2 West 48 1/2 poles to the Beginning

Then laid off the whole of the 202 1/2 acres into seven
