with my farming utensils and all the rest of my
property by his maintaining my wife Rutha Ashby
keeping her in plenty during her natural life, and

he is to give him one horse and colt which by this my last will testament is devised to him and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend William Green and my son Peter Ashley Executors of this my last will testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or testament by me heretofore made.
