First I do allow my body to receive a decent
and Christian burial Secondly I do allow all my
lawful and just debts to be paid Item I do
will and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Ferguson
my boy Mary and her side saddle Item it is my
will and desire that all the balance of my
Estate both real and personal shall be divided into
three equal parts or shares one of said parts or
shares I do will and bequeath to my beloved wife
Mary Ferguson and one other part or share I do

I do will and be with to my Daughter Nancy
Glenn Ferguson and one other part or share
which is the third or last share I give bequeath
to my son John Wallace Ferguson I do also will
and ordain that my land which I now live on
and the same that I purchased from James
Borough shall be sold at any time by my
Administrators or Executors hereinafter mentioned

It is also my will and desire that my Executors
shall Rent said land if they think proper till
such time as they may have an opportunity of
selling it to the best advantage & to sell on
what credit they may think proper & to
set in all cases to the best of their judgment
for the benefit of my heirs I do also authorize
& empower my Executors jointly or any one of
them to pay the balance due John Durham
of the price of my land and get a deed from
him and at any time when they can sell said
land I do authorize them or any one of them to
make the purchaser a deed which shall be
binding on my heirs forever I do also will
and ordain that my Executors shall as soon
as they collect money arising from the sale of my
estate pay one third part thereof to my beloved
wife Mary Ferguson and the other two thirds to
be put on Interest for the benefit of my two
Children except what may be necessary for
their raising and schooling which shall be
applied in that way and in order that
this my will & testament may be put into
