In the name of God amen I Thomas Shanklin of the County of and State of Kentucky being advanced in years but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner as follows I give my daughter Nancy Hopkins the Widow of Ephraim Hopkins ^{deceased} during her Widowhood and if not married during her natural life the use of Eighty acres of Land ^{situate in a tract of land} lying in the County of Logan and State of said On where she now lives it being a part of a tract of land conveyed to me by Soling Ewing as Sheriff of Logan County then if she should ^{at my death} ~~marry~~ the land to be sold as my other property and if she should remain unmarried then she is to continue on said land during her natural life the land to be bounded as follows beginning at the South West corner of said tract which starts not far from Timothy Gons spring and running with the same line of said tract until it crosses the road leading from said Nancy Hopkins to the Bridge over Whippoorwill creek on the road leading from Russellville to Hopkinsville thence such a course as to strike where the Westpaster fence and the old field joins and with the adjoining fence till near the far end of that square thence towards the North so as to strike the South East corner of the field North of the Dwelling house thence a north course 23 poles thence such a course as to inclose Eighty acres of Land and said Land is to be sold at my death as my other property and divided among ~~my~~ ^{my} ~~part~~ ^{part} in the following manner I give twenty dollars each and it is my Will that the balance of my estate be divided in the manner and form following to my
