One bed and clothing and ten dollars to be raised out of my estate and the balance of my household goods lands debts and movable effects at the death of my wife I give and dispose of in the following manner viz the whole to be sold and equally divided amongst all my children viz Charles Emerson. Nancy Kirk dory Garrison Peggy Satter Pelly Joist and

Helair Emerson by themselves to be possessed enjoyed and disposed of as they shall think fit and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former testament. With legacies bequests and bequeathments touching and confirming this and no other to be my last will & testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & sixteen

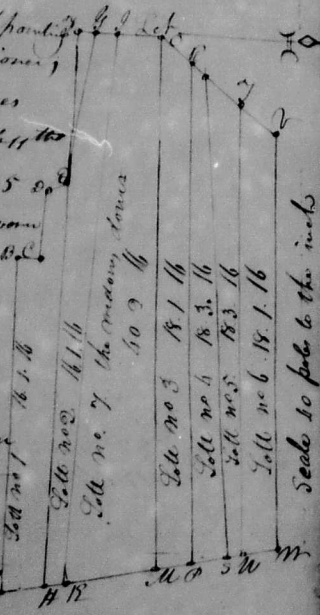

In pursuance of an order of the Fleming County Court appointing as the undersubscribers commissioners to divide the lands of the heirs of James Patton dead we presented out the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Feb. 1825 and the 18<sup>th</sup> day of February 1825 to execute said order and being first sworn to make a most equitable division we first ascertained that the land adjoining tracts of Land on the matters of Johnston belonging to said heirs contains one hundred and fifty seven and one half acres 32 poles we then laid off to the widow of said deceased what we <sup>considered</sup> to be ~~thought~~ the one equal third of the land and profits of the said two tracts and the balance we divided into six equal shares and the heirs agreeing among themselves for some of the sells and the balance down for they were disposed of in the following manner
