children Phily Hurst Medley Hurst Allen
Hurst and Nelson Hurst. In case of her
altering her state she shall nevertheless be
entitled to one third of my estate and
in such case the children if not grown
to choose their guardians. I also request my friend
and neighbour Nelson Hunt to act as executor
to my beloved wife Polly who shall
not be held to security but shall freely as my
executors do and execute all such things
as contained in this will in witness whereunto

I give commit all my tract of land & farm which I now live on to my beloved wife for her use & then of raising & educating my children. (Item) I give unto my loving wife my ~~negro boy~~ ^{negro boy} Sam & negro girl Matilda during her life ~~then~~ ^{then} as she may think proper. (Item) I further give to my

loving wife all the present stock I now own, also all the household & kitchen furniture, I hold open my just debts are paid. (Item) I bequeath to my son Wm A Fleming two hundred & ten acres of land where his Grand Father now lives. (Item) I also do bequeath to my daughter Harriet M Fleming, 80 acres of land apart from the farm I now live on also. (Item) I now give to my daughter Eliza R Fleming 30 acres of land which is the whole of

homestead 630 acres of the said above mentioned land should fall short of the number of acres for my Executors to make an equal division of said land amongst my children above mentioned. The said tract of land my loving wife is to hold in her possession until my children are raised, then draw her 5th parts of the said & when it during her natural life then return to my children. (Item) Lastly I do nominate constitute & appoint Wm A Fleming my executor of this my last will & testament as well as all my other wills by me made & acknowledging this only to be my last will & testament.
