thought for the same do make and publish to  
this my last will and testament in manner and form  
following that is to wit I give and bequeath unto my  
beloved wife Ann <sup>(Wife)</sup> all my Probable Property or Estate for her  
proper use and behoof during her natural life and  
then at her decease it is my will and request that all the  
Property then remaining of my estate is to be given to John  
Carmichael provided he takes and provides for me and  
my wife during my natural life and after my decease  
if the said John Carmichael should fail or neglect to take  
good care and provide for my wife then in that case  
then it is my will that my wife should have of it my whole  
estate as she may think proper in testimony whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of May 1839  
and thousand eight hundred and twenty nine nothing  
all other wills or parts of wills
