I Almighty for the same do make and publish
this my last will and testamene in manner and form
following that is to say I give and bequeath unto my
beloved wife ^{my} ~~Amie~~ ^{Anne} my Marable Property & estate for her
proper use and behoof during her natural life and
then at her decease it is my will and request that all the
Property then remaining of my estate is to be given to John
Cassidy provided he takes care provides for me and
my wife during her natural life and after my death
it the 18th June Campbell should fail or neglect to take
good care and provide for my wife then in that case
then it is my will that my ^{step} wife of it my whole
estate as she may think proper in testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of May in
one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine and nothing
all other wills or parts of will
