m In the name of god Amen. I Catherine Emmons of Fleming County and commonwealth of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory, and knowing that I am born to die do make and ordain this my Last will and testament in manner and form following:

Item I will that my body be buried in the family burying ground in a plain decent manner without pomp or funeral parade

Item I will that all my just debts funeral and other expences be paid immediately after my decease

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my nephew William Strawder Emmons / son to my brother William Emmons

Property by him to be passed forever after he may arrive at the age of twentyone years- and should my nephew William Strawder Emmons arrive to that age I give devise and bequeath the same to my brother William Emmons- It is ~~also~~ my wish that my brother William Emmons should have the use of my land until my nephew arrive at the age proper to take charge of the same-

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my nephew Daniel B Emmons thirty dollars in money-

Item the Ballance of my money I wish to be put at interest until my brother William Emmons children each arrive at the age of twenty one that is until each arrive at that age or marry at which time an equal division shall be made giving to each their quato and at any time that any one may receive their portions the remainder to be put at interest for the benefit of the minor heirs in like manner until the youngest arrive at the age of twenty one, or marry, unto them I give the same forever, Item I give unto my brother William Emmons wife my saddle, the remainder of my personal property. I give devise and bequeath unto my brother William Emmons unto him and his heirs assigns I give the same forever

Lastly, I nominate, constitute and appoint my brother William Emmons Executor of this my last will and testament, I also desiring that the Honorable Court having cognisance of the same shall not demand of him security for his Executorship hereby revoking all former wills by me made and confirming this alone to be my Last will, which I seal publish and declare the sixth day of October A.D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty three
