In pursuance of an order of the Fleming County Court appointing us Thomas Porter Leake & John Stockton Dorsay & Stockton and Joseph Morrison commissioners to assign to Issabella Dorsay widow of the late Edward Dorsay deceased her dower in the lands and slaves of said decedant after being first sworn we proceeded to make said assignment on the 19th and 20th days of November 1833 which we done in the following manner

we assigned three slaves (to wit) Milly, Molly Ann and Issabella to said Issabella Dorsay widow aforesaid which we consider to be the one equal third of ten slaves (to wit) Milly, Molly Ann, Issabella, Isaac, Mariah and her child Ephraim, Henry, Amanda, James and Virat that was produced to us for division

We then assigned to said widow what we consider to be the one equal third of the following Lands which the said Edward Dorsay did

Seized and possessed of (viz) two tracts conveyed to said Dorsay by George Stockton one of them containing 104 acres 20 poles and the other 33 acres and a fraction; one other tract being Latt R one of the division of the

Land of the late Geo. Stockton deceased containing 87 3/4 acres three acres in the town of Herringburg containing eleven acres and a fraction and whole square of intety in said town on which the Manton house of the late Edward Dorsay did stand and two and a fraction intety on the south side of Main Street in said town opposite the Manton house. In making making the the assignment we assign to said widow sixty acres part of the tract of 104 acres aforesaid which include the dwelling house and barn and part of the Orchard that is now occupied by said Issabella Dorsay widow aforesaid and bounded as follows Beginning at figure one a stake in the state road

corner to said tract of 104 acres thence N 7 1/2° W with a line 120 of the same 27 1/2 poles to 1/2 a stake thence East 118 1/2 poles to 3/4 a stake where a white oak bears S 5 1/2° E 26 links thence N 53 1/4° E 115 1/2 poles to 1/4 a stake in the middle of road from Flemingburg to Washington thence S 46° E with the middle of the road 50 1/2 poles to 1/2 a stake thence S 1 1/4° E with poles to 1/4 a stake corner to said 104 acres thence S 35 1/4° W with the post & rail in front of the Chesley in meeting house 10 poles to 1/4 a stake in the middle of the road thence S 60° E with the road 6 poles to 1/4 a stake thence S 43 1/4° W 21 poles crossing the Latt branch to 1/4 a stake near the branch in the middle of the Blue lick road thence S 53 1/4° W with the middle of the road 45 1/2 poles to 1/4 a stake in a line of Stockton's possession at 10 00 acres

In the name of god amen. I David Howe of Fleming
County the County and Commonwealth of Kentucky: being of Sound
Mind and memory and knowing that I am approaching
my dissolution do make and ordain this my last will
in manner and form following

Item I will that my body be disposed of in the burying
yard at the Union meeting house near unto the place where
the remains of my late wives were laid the same to be
performed in a plain decent manner without funeral
 pomp or any unnecessary expence whatever.

Item I will that my last & last funeral expences be
paid in as short a time as the nature of the case will
admit. Item I give unto the heirs of my late son Samuel
Howe five dollars I also give unto each of my children
viz. Sally, Murphy, Joseph Howe, Robert Howe, David
Howe, Sally Howe, Peggy Jones, Mahala Daugherty, five
dollars each to be paid out of any money belonging to
my estate within one year after my decease.

I will that my slaves as named shall be disposed of
in the following manner viz. My negro woman Hannah
named Hannah, also Caroline a negro woman & wife to the
above named Jim, with her children viz. George, Mattington
& Elizabeth, as also her future increase together with
Amanda, Charles & John, Slaves and children of the above
named Hannah the whole of those above named I hereby
give them freedom: and do earnestly request the Honorable
Judges of the court of Fleming county, having the proper
authority to grant them certificates of their freedom,
clearing them from the date of my decease, of all involun-
tary servitude forever. Item my negro boy Thomas
Harrison, I give unto my son Robert Howe by him
to be holden until the first day of November 1808
one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight.
Item my negro girl, Lucinda I give unto my daughter
Mahala Daugherty, by her, to be holden until the first
day of November 1808 one thousand eight hundred and
thirty eight. I give unto my son

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David Howe by him to be holden until the first
day of September 1808 one thousand eight hundred
and forty five, Item my negro boy, Dick I give unto
my daughter Sally Howe, by her to be holden until the
first of December, one thousand eight hundred and
forty eight.

Item The four last mentioned Slaves viz. Thomas
Harrison, Lucinda, Jerry and Dick according to
the term of gift when expired will each each
arrive at the age of twenty one at which time
I earnestly request the court (as in the case of
those first mentioned) to grant them certificates
of freedom clearing each as his or her term may
expire from all manner of involuntary servitude
whatever I do hereby release them forever after
they arrive at the age of twenty one from
all involuntary servitude to any person or persons
whatever.

Item my negro boy Colonel I wish the county court
for Fleming to bind as an apprentice to some
mechanical trade until the first of September
one thousand eight hundred & forty four at the
expiration of which time I give him freedom
and request the court to grant him certificates
sufficient to guarantee to him every right
in Law, of a free man of colour clearing
him in future of all involuntary servitudes.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my negro woman
Hannah (in consideration of the faithful services rendered
me by her) a Log cabin with a stone chimney including
the yard and garden now occupied by her together with
all the land lying below the Lane after one hundred
and fifty acres is laid off as here in after to be
named during

proper to occupy the same personally, for the purpose
of maintaining herself and her three children viz. Hannah,
Charles & John, I also wish that in renting the same
that Jim, a son of Hannah, shall at all times have
the premises and at any time that the said Hannah
may see proper to remove, the premises allotted her in
this Item shall be rented for a term of five years
and the profits arising thereby shall be given unto
her to defray expenses &c; but in case of choosing
to remain, I hereby give her the said premises during
her life. I also give unto my faithful slave Han-
nah, Twelve Sheep, thirtyfive gase five hogs, one cow
board, a Loom & gear a cow one Bed and furniture
now in her possession a Saddle mare known
by the name of Peg, one ten gallon kettle, one pot
one oven & kettle & a large and small wheel, a Reel and
four common chairs together with my Sermon.
All of which personal property I give devise and
bequeath unto my said faithful slave Hannah
and unto her and her assigns I give devise and
bequeath the same forever.

From the upper part of my farm (the lane being the
line) with exception of the cabin, yard & garden
given Hannah I give devise and bequeath unto
my son John Howe to him and unto his heirs
and assigns forever I give devise and bequeath the
same. I also give unto my said son John all
money together with all the personal property
that may remain after defraying all expenses,
paying the different legacies herein contained
&c; to him and his heirs I give same, and whereas
my said son John has been absent for many
years, that I do not know that he is living, not
having heard from him, and that in case of
his being dead, not leaving an heir, or heirs I
hereby devise this Item as follows, viz. the same to be
divided equally amongst my four daughters.

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Polly Murphy, Sally Howe, Peggy Jones, & Maria
Daugherty, unto them and unto their heirs and assigns
forever, I give devise and bequeath the same.
I.E. after the term of five years after my decease
provided in all cases that my said son John nor his
heirs, can be heard from, It shall be the duty
of my Executors to make diligent enquiry thro' the
medium of the most public Newspaper at
Washington city, in time of each Session of Congress
during the said term of five years.

From my farm now occupied by Ben Thinton, my
old residence containing one hundred and fifty
acres to be sold off or divided from the land
given Hannah by a line running North
and South to include the quantity above mention-
ed. The same I will to be sold, and the money
arising therefrom to be put at interest until
my son John's first daughter, name not recollect-
ed, at which time she shall be entitled to the
one half, and my late son William Howes son
William to have the other half when at the
age of twenty one years, and in case either or
both these Legates should fail to call for the
legacy in this Item, death depriving them
I do hereby give the same to be equally divided
amongst my four Daughters, viz. Sally Murphy
Sally Howe Peggy Jones and Maria Daugherty
to them and their heirs, I give the same fore-
ever. From that part of my farm allotted to my
negro woman Hannah, when it shall return unto
my estate in any manner before mentioned.
I will that the same shall be sold.

by my name viz. David Howe, Son to my son David
