Be it remembered that on this the seventh day of May in the year of our Lord 1839 This indenture bargain purchase and release into between James Johnston Senr ^{man, defendant} of the Fleming county of the one part & ^{of the} other part ~~Antony~~ that the S^r Johnston being in a weak & feeble State of Body unable to take care of himself doth hereby agree to & with S^r Dabrypsee to take care of provide for and treat him in a human manner & furnish him with all the necessaries of life such as must elicit lodging wearing apparel nursing & attention as far as appears enable & right to the S^r Dabrypsee doth hereby covenant & agree to do & perform all these S^r John's & attendants to & for the S^r Johnston or procure it done for him & for & carry his natural life & the S^r Dabrypsee to have a reasonable compensation for his troubles, ^{& mention} ~~and~~ his money which is coming to me the S^r Johnston from millions & millions for the land & principles which he purchased of S^r Johnston the notes for which is deposited in the hands of John Deere the notes into the w^o for the notes being four in number to be paid annually the amt. They call for is about \$60

The first come due the 10th day of March next.

This compensation to S^r Dabrypsee is to be paid States & determined with the amt. by the witnesses now chosen by the S^r Dabrypsee on his part and by the other party to be chosen by John Deere as agent for the S^r Johnston & if they can agree they are to call in & inquire the first annual instalment of the compensation to be received in one year or twelve months from this date & it is my will & wish that S^r Johnston should be any overplus after my decease & paying all demands debts against me S^r Johnston that I do hereby give & bequeath the whole all & every species of property claim & interest & every description I may have or have or be entitled to in any way unto the S^r Johnston Dabrypsee his heirs & as a compensation to him for past services to reward & testify the testimony whereof the parties have hereunto subscribed their names the day and date first written Improvements

I John Deere do hereby acknowledge that I have the notes referred to in the foregoing which I obligate my self to demand for when called for as they may become due or I can collect them but not to be accountable if I can not collect them or any part thereof Witness my hand this 7th day of May 1839.

Also two notes on James Johnston for twenty five dollars each due to James on the 31st December 1839 the first —
The other due 31st December 1830 I am to account for as above at account held for Fleming county on the 1st Nov. 1839. This writing preparing to be the last will and testament of James Johnston Senr was pronounced in court previously the oath of Truman Day & David Hopkins and names & names which is now Attest Joshua Hockton clk.
