In the name of God amen. I Elisha Vansandt of the county of Fleming County & State of Ky. Being of perfect mind & memory & sensible of the uncertainty of this mortal life do make this my last will and testament
First I bequeath my body to the care of friends whomever I come in a decent Christian burial and my spirit I resign to God who gave it Secondly as to my estate with which it has pleased God to bless me
It is my will that all my just debts be paid
Thirdly it is my will that my sons James Elijah & daughter Sarah shall have each upon demand either in money or property as at the time of demand may be most convenient the sum of fifteen dollars to make up to them with what they have received their parts equal with my three children to her Polly & Milam
Fourthly It is my will that my daughter Patsy & her children shall have each on demand either in property or money as at the time of demand may be the sum of sixty five dollars to make them equal with what they have received as above
Fifthly it is my will that my three children Rebecca Margaret & Elisha shall have on demand either in money or property as before the sum of one hundred & six dollars which I consider equivalent to what has been given and allotted to my other children above
