In the name of god amen

I Nicholas Gardner of Fleming County Kentucky being in health and of sound mind knowing that all men are born to die make this my last will and testament revoking all others

1st I Recommend my soul to god who gave it

2nd that all my debts be paid and if my beloved wife should live longer than myself my will is that she possess all the benefits of my real and personal estate during her natural life then at her death it is my will that my negro girl Doll with her children be free if she have any and if she should have children and not be able to maintain them her self in that case my will is they be bound out till they are twenty one years old the males to some mechanical art and that Doll have a bed and bedding which will be set apart for her by me and my wife

and as to the balance of my estate after the death of my self and wife my will is that an equal division be made between all my brothers and sisters including my sister Hurst two daughters that is Elizabeth and Daisy also my negro girl Doll to have an equal part with them as above stated and if any of them should be dead there parts

to descend to these children it is further my will that my negro girl Doll have the liberty to choose a trustee and her part be put in his hands to manage for her till she is capable of managing for herself I further make it will that if my wife should out live myself in that case I appoint her my executor in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17 of November 1837
