and publish this my last will and testament

First it is my will that all my just debts be paid,
after which it is my will and desire that my
wife have one equal third of my real estate and
Slaves for and during her natural life. she is to
have one third of my personal estate in fee
Simple, the rest and residue of my estate both
real and personal is to be equally divided amongst
all my children, viz Saml. C Pearce, Lewis C Pearce,
Elias Pearce, Wiram Pearce, Lucinda Pearce, William
Pearce, Charles Pearce, & Isaac Pearce and to
my Grand children William & Lucinda Dicklin
children of my Daughter Charlotte dec'd are to have
one share charging them them with \$1000 which
I have advanced to their Father and hold his note
for my sons Samuel & Lewis C & Wiram
Pearce are each to be charged with the sum
of \$1000 as advanced them also and hold their
notes for upon each of all these notes no later
is to charged,

It is my will and desire that my Sister & Mother
occupy the room they now enjoy for and dur-
ing their natural lives and that they shall have
a maintainance out of my estate as long as they
live. It is my will and wish that all my Slaves
which I may own at my death which were from
my property shall be free as follows the males
at the age of forty and females at the age of
thirty and the infirm (if any) shall be maintained
out of my estate. To Lucinda Dicklin my Grand Daughter
I give negro Amada free of charge

Lastly I constitute my sons Saml. C Lewis C &
Wiram Pearce Executors of this my last will and
