435 Dudley I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ann Dudley all my Plate cupboard ware of every description y all the ballance of my house hold y kitchen furniture and loom y apparatus y all the wool carpets now on hand y together with all the furniture in and about the house also one cow y all my Books, Jewels and bequeath all the ballance of the debts due y demands owing incoming to me after the paying of all my Just debts to be divided equally between my sons William John James John Joseph y Taylor Dudley y my daughters Nancy Ann Stockton Elizabeth Bannay y Mary Ann Dudley I will and bequeath to my afore said nine children y my son Simon one Negro Girl named Juliana the said Negro girl being one of the increase of a Negro woman named Hannah which was willed to me by my late husband William Dudley deceased I appoint Galen Stockton Executor of this my Last Will y testament
