I John Wood of the County of Fleming and State of Kentucky being weak of body but of perfect mind and memory knowing that it is appointed me for me to do I do make and as soon as my last will and testament and of the goods and chattels whereof God has made me rich I do make the following disposal viz
I first I commend my soul to God who gave

and my body to the land to be buried in a decent Christian like manner and my funeral expenses, & all my just debts to be paid out of my Estate -

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my son Stewart one hundred acres of Land to be laid off agreeable to the judgment of Robert Stewart and John Gallacher with a strict eye to justice, as it respects the rest of the heirs

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my son Stewart one hundred acres of Land to be laid off agreeable to the mode pointed out above and by the same persons -

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann the balance of my tract of Land, to include the place where Adam Wood now lives fifty acres more or less

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my son James Wood one hundred Dollars.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary twenty-one hundred Dollars.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my sons Adam & William Wood two Dollars each and to be paid out of my personal property

Item 8th It is my will that all the balance of my Estate be equally divided among my sons Stewart & John and my Daughter Ann

Item 9th I do hereby Ordain & Appoint my friends Robert Stewart and John Gallacher my true and faithful executors, to execute and fulfill this my last will and testament whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this 3rd day of December in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five

I Philip Belvestine of the County of Fleming and State of Kentucky finding myself weak in Body, but being fully sound in mind & memory thank be to God, and calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of the God who gave. And my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent & Christianlike manner at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting that at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith I have pleased God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of in the following manner & form that is, to say principally and first of all I give & bequeath to Rebecca my beloved wife all my personal property also I give & bequeath to my son John Belvestine, the sum of two Dollars out of the personal property for his part
