except fifty dollars in gold or silver or a horse Beast
with that much to be paid by executors or administrators
which I do will and bequeath to my youngest son Benj
Hunt and I do give to my daughter Elizabeth one Cote
and I do will and bequeath after my death my wife Polly Hunt
has enjoyed my estate agreeable to the foregoing provisions
of this will that my estate be equally divided amongst all
my children to wit; Lemuel Hunt, Bader Hunt, Hodum
Hunt, James Hunt, John Hunt, Honora Honora
Hunt, William Hunt, and P Hunt Benjamin
Hunt and Sally Hunt and I allow by this my will
and appoint Bader Hunt & Hodum Hunt my
sons administrators to this my last will and testament and
executors of my estate signed and sealed this thirty
first day of August one thousand eight hundred
