In obedience to an order of the Fleming County Court of January 1853 we
 Burth Kings, James Markwell & Henry Powers three of the commissioners appointed
 by said Order being first duly sworn met at the of Robert H. Elliott Esq on
 the 10th day of January 1853 and proceeded to divide the slaves of John A. Bess
 Intype Decd. among his heirs & legal Representatives there is twenty one
 Slaves of the following names to wit Henry, Jane, Austin, Bryant, L. S. S. S.
 Mariah, Minney, & her child two months old, Lapham, Harry, & Mary and
 her child two months old, George, Jack, Pleasant, Martha, Caroline
 Emily, Newton, Alfred and Vesty, we then proceeded to allot and assign
 to each & Elliot the widow and relict of said John A. Bess the
 following slaves as her dower in the above named slaves to wit
 Minney, Shetters, Minney and her child, Austin & Jack. The Widow

of said Slaves we valued at the following prices and allotted the same to his heirs in the following manner to wit To Nicholas McIntyre we allotted Harry a negro man at the price of 400 To Howard McIntyre we allotted Bryant at \$170 & Pleasant at \$225 395
To Van McIntyre George at 400
To John & Congleton & Malvina his wife & Malvina McIntyre Daphney 200
To Amanda McIntyre Vinny & her child at \$400
To James McIntyre Martha & Newton at 300
To Thomas McIntyre Jim Vesty & Alfred at 400
To Mary McIntyre Clarick at 400
To Washington McIntyre Emily & Caroline 285
There being nine shares the whole amount of Slaves which we have divided among said heirs we think worth \$3430 and \$381.11cts being each heirs proportion. we determine and allot that Nicholas McIntyre shall pay to the guardian of Washington McIntyre the sum of \$68.89 cents that being the amount which he owes over and above his own share we allot and determine that Howard McIntyre shall pay over to the Guardian of Washington the sum of \$13.89 cents that being the amount which he owes over and above his portion of said Slaves. we allot and determine that Van McIntyre shall pay over to the Guardian of Washington the sum of \$13.38 cents that being a sufficiency to make Washingtons share at \$30.11 we allot and determine that Van McIntyre shall pay over to the guardian of James McIntyre the sum of \$5.56 cents the balance which he has got over and above his share. we allot and determine that John & Congleton & Malvina his wife shall pay over to the guardian of James McIntyre the sum of \$18.89 cents the amount which they have got over and above their portion we allot and determine that Amanda McIntyre shall pay over to the guardian of James McIntyre the sum of \$18.89 cents that being the amount over and above her share. we allot and determine that Thomas McIntyre and Mary McIntyre shall pay over to the guardian of James McIntyre the sum of eight hundred dollars & 89 cents each that being the amount over and above their shares. and these sums when paid will make each share equal.

Will

In the name of God Amen

I Thomas Jefferson of the town of Flemingsburg being sick but of sound mind I do make this my last will and testament my body is to be buried in a decent and christian like manner and my grave to be covered with a tomb at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned as to my property both real and personal altho paying my Just debts I give and devise the same to my beloved wife to be used by her during her life at her discretion and whatever shall remain at her death is to be divided amongst my poorest relations, say

according to their present property and my Executors to be the sole Judge of that I have a stock of horses on hand & some Slaves my Executor is authorized to sell them if he thinks necessary & he to be the sole Judge lastly I appoint William Fleming and Robert McCart my sole Executors of this my last will and testament revoking all others.
