In obedience to an order of the County Court of Flem-
ing County appointing us the undersubscribers
Seth Batts, Wm. Pettinung and Thomas Porter, three
of the Commissioners to divide the Land and
Slaves of the Late John Palmer deceased between
his widow and heirs, after being first sworn
we proceeded on the 14th day of October and
22nd day of November 1833 to divide said estate
which we done in the following manner
(to wit) we allotted to Nancy G. Palmer widow
of said Palmer deceased four Negroes, to wit, Ginny
Kendall, Mary, and Thornton, considering them
to be the one equal third of eleven to wit, Ginny
Kendall, Mary, Thornton, Hannah, Harrison
Dick, Jack, Westley, Ellen and Silander. This
was presented to us for division. We then
added two others that had been advanced by

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The said John Palmer dec'd to Henry Palmer
and Penelope ^{his} wife to the remainder of said
servants making in all nine, which we divided
between the said Palmer four children
Sally

To Henry Palmer and Penelope ^{his} wife
late Penelope McFarmer, we allotted Alice and
Jefferson, To Elizabeth Kemper Palmer, Han-
nah and Harrison, To Judith Hathaway
Palmer Westley, Ellen and Silander, and
To John Edmund Palmer Dick and Jack
each being partian we consider an equal
fourth of said nine Slaves,

We then divided five tracts of Land that the said
John Palmer dec'd died seized and possessed of,
lying adjoining each other near the town of Flem-
ingburg one of them conveyed to said Palmer
by one other of them by Benedict

Hooby, two of them by Snodde and the
other by Joshua Dorsey we first ascertained
that the remainder of said Land, the said
Palmer having sold a part of one of the said
measures three hundred sixteen acres two
Roods and 23 poles which the out bounding
of the annexed plat represents, out of which
we allotted to the widow, Nancy G. Palmer
sixty two acres and forty four poles which
we consider the one equal third of the Land
and profits of of said 316¹/₂ acres 23 poles
which includes the dwelling house and house
Barn and Stables and Orchard and bound-
ed as follows, Beginning at figure one a
stake in the middle of the county road from
Flemingburg to Andrews

West of a Blue ash corner to the tract from Northy then
 S 72° E 212 poles to (1) a stone thence south 217 $\frac{1}{2}$ to (2)
 a stake in Palmer and Botto's line where a white
 oak bears N 77° W 21 links thence S 79° $\frac{3}{4}$ W with
 Palmer and Botto's line 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to (4) a stake oppo-
 site a white oak thence North 410 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to (5) a
 stake in the middle of the road to Williams mill
 thence N 45° with the middle of the road 54

We then laid off the balance of the Land into
 four equal Lots considering them with regard to
 quantity and quality and assigned Lot No 1 to John En-
 mand Palmer containing forty eight acres and eight
 eight poles and bounded as follows Begining at
 figure (2) a stone corner to the widows dower thence
 S 72° East 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to (20) a stake and two sugar
 trees Palmers corner thence South with Palmers and
 Botto's line 123 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to (21) a white oak Botto's cor-
 ner thence S 40° W with another of Palmers and
 Botto's lines 95 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to (22) a white oak ash then
 hush and a Rose cedar stump Palmers and Botto's
 corner thence S 89° $\frac{3}{4}$ W with another of their line
 34 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to (23) a stake corner to the widows dower
 where a white oak bears N 77° W 21 links
 thence North with the dower 219 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to the
 begining

 Palmer containing fifty six acres three rods
 and 39 poles and bounded as follows Begin

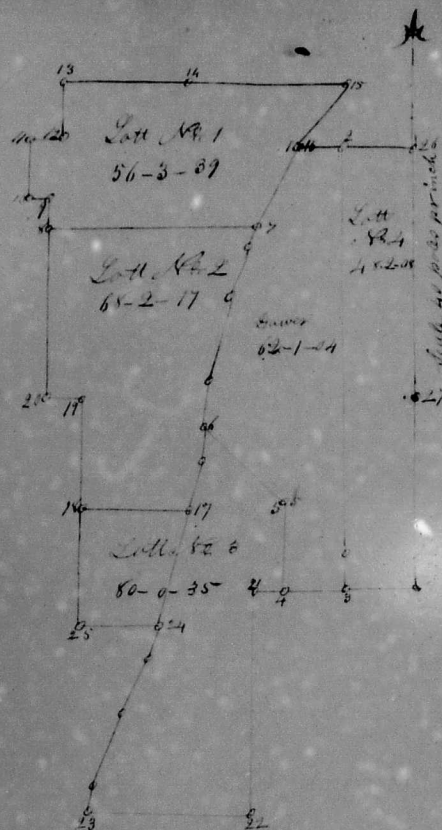
