I Jacob Chrisman of Fleming County and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory do make publish and declare this my last will and testament, in manner following. To wit.

First I desire that all my just debts and funeral expeces be paid out of my estate as speedily as possible

Second I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Chrisman (in case she should be the longest lived) all my estate both real and personal also all monies or debts that may be due to me at my decease for her entire use during her natural life and whereas myself and wife are both aged and infirm and a possibility that we or either of us may require the assistance of some friend to take care of us, and having a firm reliance that that friendly aid will be afforded to us or either of us in that event my will and desire is that such person affording such assistance shall be reasonably and fully compensated for such assistance out of my estate

My will and desire further is that after the decease of my said wife in the event of her being the longest lived my executor hereinafter named shall sell all the property that may be left both real and personal to the best advantage as the circumstances of said estate will admit of within three months after her decease and the proceeds arising therefrom together with all monies or debts that may be left at her decease after paying all her just debts and funeral expences shall be equally divided into two equal parts, one of which shall go to my brother Matthias Chrisman and his heirs

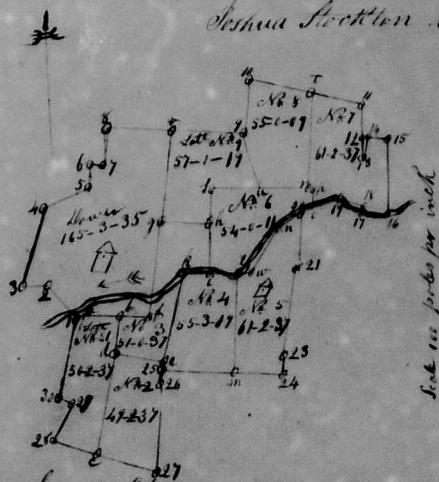

In pursuance of an order of the Fleming County Court appointing
us the undersubscribers three of the commissioners to divide the lands
and Slaves of the late William Threlkild deceased between his
Heirs after being first sworn we proceeded to make said division
on the 3rd of October 1832; in making said division

we first assigned to Betsey Threlkild widow of said decedent John Threlkild
an and old Sal three of nine Slaves that was presented to us for division
we considered the above named Slaves to the one equal third of the nine,
the other six (to wit) Pallow, George, Titus, Peter Rice and others, we
could not divide equally between the Heirs and consequently left
them for a future division we then divided one tract of Land
situate in the bounty of Fleming on Johnston Creek on which
the said William Threlkild decd. last lived which he held by deeds
from Badly Mills and Bayley we first ascertained that it con-
tained 663 Acres two Rods and eight poles we divided said tract
of Land between the and the heirs considering it with regard
to quantity and quality which the following notes and references
will explain

The first laid off to Betsey Threlkild widow of said one hundred
and sixty line acres three Rods and thirty line poles which we
consider the one equal third of said farm which includes
the dwelling house out houses and Orchard where the widow lives
and is bounded as follows. Beginning at figure one on the annex-
ed Plat a white oak two Iron roads and Elm on the bank
of the Creek corner to Threlkild decd from Badly thence with the
