upon this special condition that he these Alexander

is to support his two sisters Emily Mary & Nancy on the place & them to live with him so long as they may all remain single and if at any time that either Mary or Nancy should be cause to marry then and in that case the said Alexander is to give to Nancy a good Horse or mare & cowe some Colffe and all that Mary a good Horse or mare & cowe & Colffe as also one Leather Bed & Trunk & Bureau to each Nancy & Mary as they now claim as theirs and all the ballance of household Furniture and Farming utensils & Stock of every description I give to my son Alexander to him and his legal heirs for ever and it is my further will & designe that in case Alexander should die without lawful issue that then & in that case it is my wish that the same & farm that I now live on with all the Stock that then may be on the place & Farming utensils & household Furniture not otherwise disposed of shall be equally divided between Nancy & Mary and if in case that Alexander Mary & Nancy should die without lawful issue then in that case I will the whole of my estate to my son John I amenable the Son of John both as to personal to him & his heirs for ever & whereas my son John Joseph & daughter Jane & Catherine each of them have married and have received from me what I am right for them at this time I now give to each of them the sum of one dollar each and it is my will & designe that William P. Fleming so long as he lives that he would attend my concerns that may be necessary in the full & final arrangement of this my last will.
