and make this to be my will and testament revoking
all others the Legases hereafter bequeathed or to be
discharged as soon as convenient or as circumstances
will admit and in the manner directed
I give to my wife Prudence Wallingford I give
and bequeath the use profit and benefit of
of one third of my estate including of the property
heretofore given to our children for the term of
her natural life. I give to my daughter Sarah
Walker I give and bequeath ^{sum of} ~~sum of~~ articles toge-
ther with two hundred dollars in cash mak-
ing in all four hundred and nineteen dollars
all delivered her some time past. I give to my
daughter Clarissa Brown I give and bequeath ^{sum of} ~~sum of~~
articles together with ^{two} hundred dollars in
cash all delivered her some time past making
in all three hundred and ninety five dollars
and seventy cents I give to my daughter Nancy White
I give and bequeath ^{sum of} ~~sum of~~ articles toge-
ther with with two hundred dollars in cash
all delivered her some time past making in
all three hundred and ninety nine dollars
all delivered her some time past I give to my son
Joseph Wallingford I give and bequeath ^{sum of} ~~sum of~~
articles together with two hundred dollars in cash
all delivered him some time past making in
all four hundred dollars. I give to my son A. H.
Wallingford I give and bequeath the sum of four
hundred and fifty dollars if he goes into the busi-
ness of selling of goods which he talks of at
this time but if he should not go in to busi-
ness and should marry and need such articles

The rest of my married children got he can have them. I am to my son Daniel P Wallingford I give and bequeath four hundred dollars to be discharged in same manner that the rest of my married children got their Legacies when he is twenty one years of age or when he is married. I am to my daughter Mary Ann Stonehead I give and bequeath Landre articles to gether with one black girl by the name of Jude all given her same time last making in all four hundred and thirty five dollars all delivered her same time last. I am to my daughter Chloe Ann Wallingford I give and bequeath four hundred dollars to be given her when she is married or when she becomes 21 years of age to be discharged in the same way that the rest of my married children was I am to my daughter Elizabeth M Wallingford I give and bequeath four hundred dollars when she is married or when she becomes 21 years of age to be paid in the same way of the rest of my married children I am to my son Wm P Wallingford I give and bequeath four hundred dollars to be him when he is married or when he becomes 21 years of age to be paid in cash or a part of it in property which ever he may choose as to my Land I wish my wifes third part laid off and the balance equally divided among my children and all the rest of my property together with all the back that I may be posessed off at that time to be sold at 12 months credit but the blacks not to be sold to what is termed negro traders neither directly or indirectly but for my executors to procure them

Good homes and pay of all my just debts I wish what ever may be left to be equally divided among all my children but let it be speedily understood that the part that may fall to Sarah Walker my wish is that it should be laid out for land by my executors for the benefit of her and her children and in that way that her present husband cant touch the principle and at the death of my wife I wish the ballance of my property sold and divide in the same way as directed above lastly I appoint my sons Joseph Wallingford and A. M Wallingford my executors in testimony I here unto have set my hand and fixed my Seal this 12th day of February 1833 thirty three
