only after the payment of my debts and Burial expences I give to my wife Elizabeth Skinner all my real and personal estate to have and to hold during her remaining my widow if she should marry in that case she is to be put to her thirds and the living to be equally divided between the three youngest children John Skinner Isaac Skinner and Elizabeth Skinner and also that her thirds is to go to the said named children John Skinner Isaac Skinner and Elizabeth by their paying to the eldest children that is to say Fanny Skinner of late Fanny Groves one dollar Cornelius Skinner one dollar Benjamin Skinner one dollar she neas Skinner one dollar Margaret Skinner of late Margaret Cox one dollar Ann Skinner one dollar
