

At the Mouth of my Spring branch and to run to a rock on the South side of a knob with the two first letters of his name on the rock thence north to the back line of my farm, and likewise I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Amelia one bed and bedding one cow and calf and cupboard ware in view of her dower and my son Joseph is to take care and maintain his mother for the above above named tract of land and other considerations which is the full share and part of my estate to have and no more thereof I give to my youngest daughter Anna feather bed and bedding one horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf for her full share of my estate which she has had and to have no more from I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah one bed and bedding one horse saddle and bridle one cow and calf for her full share of my estate and further I bequeath that at my death it is my will and desire that my two youngest daughters Sarah and Anna inherit the remaining of my property and to have and hold all and every part thereof and to live together until they marry either one or both and then the property that I leave at my death to be equally divided between them, this I do make and constitute to be my last will and testament revoking all former wills made by me in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the tenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one
