When I was in the name of God Amen, I Samuel Tilden of Fleming
 County and State of Kentucky being in a very low state
 of health but of sound mind and disposing memory do
 make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking
 all other wills or testaments by me heretofore made. 1st
 I come to him that gave it as my body to the earth
 I bequeath it to him that is to be of value sufficient to pay all my
 just debts and burial expenses. 2ndly I leave to my loving
 wife Mary all the residue of my Estate both real and per-
 sonal for special purpose of supporting her during her
 widowhood or moonhood together with the same children
 that may remain at home with her, at the end of
 which time it is to be divided as follows, with
 the following exceptions. 1st - that she may at any time
 have any property that is intended for them if she ever
 can spare it. 2ndly To my son Samuel T. Tilden I give the place
 known by the name of the River place and a piece of the
 same and Thomas Thompson, then to the top of the knob from
 course to the said child's River place 5th To my son John
 -well R. T. Tilden I give the place known by the name of the

Point place beginning on a branch called Plumb
 branch on the 11th lot line of Mosley survey thence down
 the branch to the creek thence down said creek as it main-
 tains to where the 11th lot line crosses thence along said line
 to the beginning
 6th To my son Saml. T. Tilden I give all the residue of my
 land in the County aforesaid that at the time place and the
 piece bought of George Reamer in relation to the exception
 before stated no how it is to be or convey any land that
 is to come to them during the life of said child and widow
 but at the age of twenty and to divide a whole
 to land or cultivate any part that they and the
 widow can agree on if they cannot agree the executor
 to say what land each may tend each year -
 7th To my son William I give and convey all the land
 and before any division to
 8th To my son Samuel T. Tilden I give one negro slave to be
 taken out before any division of the above named Mrs
 & Samuel T. Tilden cannot agree in choice of negroes, they are
 to draw lot of choice for my daughter Mary she and
 her heirs is to have no more than she has already received
 which is one hundred dollars &c.
 10th my Daughter Mary Davis nor her heirs is to have no more
 than she has already received which is thirty dollars &c.
 11th To my wife Mary, widow or moonhood all the residue
 of my Estate not otherwise disposed of to be divided as follows
 that is equally between my several children hereafter men-
 tioned, namely, Elizabeth Cooper, Evalina B. B. Matilda
 Joseph & Lane Mark New Martilla J. C. Phillips &
 Samuel B. T. Tilden & Ethelinda J. T. Tilden 12th It is mutually
 agreed between me and my wife Mary that she is
 to claim no right of dower in any case whatever but to
 relinquish the same for which she has the proper power and
 management aforesaid for the special purpose of the
 support and the same children as before mentioned
 also it is understood that the land is not to be anted nor
 the negroes hired or sold during the time of her widowhood or
 widowhood. Lastly - I do nominate and appoint my son
 Samuel T. Tilden Executor to this my last will and testament
 in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this the 26th day of July 1831
