to be my last will and testament revoking all others. I am to my
sister Emily Bruce I give and bequeath the use profit and benefit
of one moiety of my whole estate of every description for the term
of her natural life with the exception hereafter made.
I am to my sister Elizabeth Bruce I give and bequeath the use
profit and benefit of one moiety of my whole estate of every
description for the term of her natural life with the exception
hereafter made. In case of the death of either of my sisters
herebefore named my will and desire is that the surviving
sister be it which it may, shall in that event have the use
profit and benefit of whole estate for the term of her
natural life and after the departure of my two sisters before
named I then give I am to my niece Lucy Porter I devise
my woman Erracy with all her future increase to her and
her heirs, I am to my niece Harriet Dudley. I devise my woman
Rosetta and her children two amanda and constance with all
their future increase. to her and her heirs, I am to Ellen
Morgan I devise my girl Matilda with her future increase
to her and her heirs, I am to Elizabeth Bruce I devise
my girl Area with her future increase to her and her
heirs. I am to Ann Bruce junior I devise my girl Mary with
her future increase to her and her heirs. I am to Beavie
Collop I devise my boy named Andrew to him and his
heirs, I am to Henry Bruce Senior I devise my whole estate
of every description after paying my just debts with
the exception of the specific legacies heretofore named and
the exception of two of my negroes heretofore named that
I wish emancipated whereas my woman named Debby and
my man George having ever been upright and faithful
servants I find my duty to give them their freedom
I therefore do hereby give to my woman Debby her freedom
to take place at the time of the departure of my
two sisters before named I do also hereby give to my man
George his freedom to take place at the time named
for for Debby to be free, lastly I constitute and appoint
and my nephew Henry Bruce Executor of this will and
testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this fourth day of October in year 1821

I Thomas Treacle of Fleming County &
State of Kentucky being sound in mind but in a low state of health
have concluded to make my last will and testament in manner and
form following to wit, I give to my beloved wife Ann Treacle
(during her life or widow hood) my tract of land on which I now
live, all my lots in Washington Mason County and my lots in
Augusta Bracken County my tract of land in Davis County
Indiana together with my negro viz Nat Harry Susan
Arthur Alexander & David including all my stock of every
description & other property which I have to be kept
during her widowhood or decease as named at either of
these events, my wish & desire is that an equal division of
all the property may be made among my children (viz)
Stephen. John. William. Ellen. Orpha. Charlotte & Anna
I desire that Ellen Anna & William Treacle should have
a horse of the value of fifty dollars whichever they
desire it, my other children having had one. When ever
a division takes place in my negroes my wish is that, none of
them should be sold out of the family but that my
children should have them. If my wife should again marry
at this event my desire is that she take her third part
of all the property in her possession & that the balance
be equally divided among my children already named.
I wish also that that whenever any of my children marry
that my wife would give them whatever property she may
choose.

Keeping at the same time a correct account of the same, that no child may have more than another but that they may be equal. - Given from under my hand this 27th day of April 1832 in the presence of these witnesses

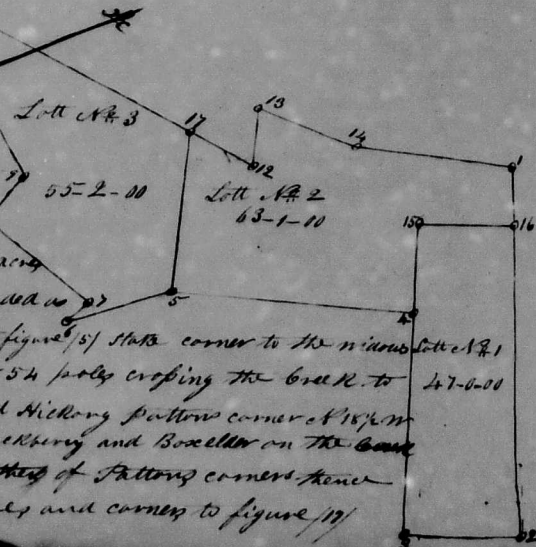
