In the name of god amen I William Robertson Sen of Fleming County and State of Kentucky being capable in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory I publish this my last will and testament in form as follows that is to say at my decease I leave to my beloved wife Sarah Robertson during her life all the tract of land where William A Robertson now lives that I purchased of William Arace one hundred and four acres three quarters and ten poles including all the houses and the improvements thereon lying and being in the County of Fleming and State of Kentucky lying on the water

Flaming Creek I loan to my beloved wife Sarah Robertson three negroes that is to say one negro man named Joseph and negro woman named Matilda and one negro boy named Alexander also two beds and sufficient furniture two bedsteads of his choice bed curtains four bed quilts of her choice also one other bed and furniture and bedstead this one bed she is to dispose of as she thinks proper. Six sitting chairs one folding leaf table one square table one chest one chimney press one bureau one large looking glass one small do one clock one time piece one candle stand one sugar basket all the cupboard wear six silver table spoons six silver tea spoons six knives and forks one carving knife and fork three watches one coffee mill shovel and tongs and all the kitchen furniture one pair of best fine dogs one trap better two trap canes ticks three smoothing irons washing tubs two large jugs and two small ones all the pails and crocks one big wheel one little wheel all the carpeting all the farming utensils and gears one carriage horse all the above mentioned property I loan to my beloved wife Sarah Robertson during her natural life and at her decease all the above mentioned property to be sold except the three above mentioned negroes and the above mentioned tract of land which will be otherwise disposed of hereafter.

I give to my beloved wife Sarah Robertson two hundred dollars cash to dispose of as she thinks proper. I leave my four wheel carriage for my executors to sell at my decease the above mentioned tract of land that I left to my beloved wife Sarah Robertson during her natural life at her decease I give to my grand son William A Robertson son of Henry Robertson and Martha his wife to him and his heirs I loan to my son Henry Robertson and Martha his wife two above mentioned negroes one negro woman named Matilda and one

negro man named Joseph during their natural life then to be equally divided amongst all their surviving children.

I loan to my daughter Betsey Dewty wife of Simpson Dewties the above named negro boy Alexander and one negro man at my decease named Anthony during her natural life then equally divided amongst all his surviving children.

also I give to my son John Robertson fifty dollars also I give to my grandson William Robertson Fleming son of John A Fleming and Betsey his wife one tract of land two hundred and seventy three acres lying in Fleming County on the north of Fleming Creek part of Fleming Station at my decease I leave it to him to take full possession of.

Also at my decease I leave the and all the improvements thereon where I now live to be sold and the money put out upon interest and all the balance of my property at my decease that is not otherwise disposed of to be sold and the money put out upon interest the interest of the money that the above mentioned lots and improvements is sold for with the interest of the money that will arise from the sale of property at my decease to be put in the hands of my beloved wife Sarah Robertson to make use of as she sees proper. The above mentioned lots and improvements to be sold at my decease lying in the County of Fleming and Town of Flemingsburg.

All of money that will arise from my property and all the property that I have left my beloved wife Sarah Robertson at her death to be equally divided between my son Henry Robertson and Martha his wife and my daughter Betsey Dewty.

Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my friends Thomas and Lewis D. Thompson

3rd I give and bequeath to my son John Johnson the
balance of my land here which is three hundred
ninety five acres and for him to dispose at his
death such property as he thinks best

4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca
Sutton the place she now lives on as it was layed
off to her and all its appertenance her life time & heirs

5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Lydia Ansel
the place she now lives on as it is layed off to her
and all its appertinances her life time & heirs

6th I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann
Mallard the place she now lives on as it is layed off to
her and all its appertinances her life time & heirs

7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Fanny Warn
a tract of land in the Ohio State of one hundred
and fifty three acres to belong to her and her and
her heirs their life time and all its appertinances

8th I give and bequeath to my daughter Deliverance
Ansel a tract of land of fifty three acres that she
now lives on her life time and heirs and all its
appertinances as it was layed off to her

9th after my decease it is my will that all my
personal property together with my two black hags
be sold according to law and my debts to be paid
and then to be equally divided among my surviving
children this tract of land belong to my daughter
Fanny Warn was not named where it layed off
