ARTICLE NO. 1: We will that our just debts and funeral expenses be first paid.

ARTICLE NO. 2: We devise and bequeath all of the rest and residue of our property of every kind and nature owned by us or either of us at the time of our deaths to Leroy Combs, of Prestonsburg, Kentucky, subject however to the limitations and reservations hereinafter set out.

ARTICLE NO. 3: Upon the death of either Jesse Hatfield or Cynthia Hatfield his or her survivor shall have the right to the use and control of all of the property hereby devised and bequeathed to the said Leroy Combs during the life time of the survivor; and upon the death of the survivor the right, possession, enjoyment and the fee simple title of all of said property shall pass to the said Leroy Combs.

ARTICLE NO. 4: We hereby appoint the said Leroy Combs as executor of this our last will, and he shall not be required to prepare or file any inventory of our estates or execute bond as such Executor, and he shall not be required to file or make any settlement of our estates.

ARTICLE NO. 5: Upon our death, or upon the death of either of us, the said Leroy Combs will attend to it and see that we are properly and respectfully buried and that our graves are properly marked, according to our station in life.

This is a summary of my last will and testament. I want my home where I live now to go to the M. E. Church South at my death in honor of my mother who was a devout Christian and a member of the Methodist Church and all of her family that has passed on before this was a request made of me by my mother that when I passed away if I had no children to leave it to and was alone to give it to the Methodist Church never to be sold but held by the Church as long as time shall last. My only request of the Church was when I passed away I wanted a respectable burial because I was alone. I want the lot from the lower yard fence down to the cross fence at the lower end of the lot for the benefit of my families graves in both cemeteries. I want the Church to see that it is rented and the tax always paid and that the graves are kept in good shape. From the cross fence down to the street I give to Merlin Turner to have the rent and pay the taxes and if he ever marries and has any heirs his wife and the heirs to hold the longest day one lives but at his death if he never marries or if he is alone it is to come back to my estate and then to the Masonic Widows and Orphans home in honor of A. H. Turner by husband and my baby James Andrew Turner who was a Mason at heart and Merlin E. Turner who was a devout Mason God Bless Them All.

My lot on Highland Avenue I want the graves in both cemeteries fixed with concrete around them and a little iron fence on top of that and monuments bought and put at both places and the rest to go to M. E. Turner, but for him not to run through with it but to go into some kind of business where he would always have something to live on now all this was to be done if I died before he did but if I was the longest liver I would sell and attend to that myself and keep the rest to live on. I intended if I passed away before Butch did for him just to live on at home as long as he lived or as I said before if he had any heirs they to hold it as long as they lived but at the last for it to pass on to the Methodist Church and remain the property of the Church as long as time shall last. I want my lot from Main Street to 2nd Street to always remain in tact as the Alice Gearheart Turner property.

P. S. I always intended it for my baby James Andrew Turner but God took him home to the good world in 1920 but when I pass away I want the church to always keep it in good repair and have a nice parsonage for the preachers and their families in honor of me & my mother. I want this will carried out to the last thing just as I say. Butch said the lot where the Marlow building now stands was mine if it is I want Crit, to have it and collect all the rent from the time it first started and keep it for himself but I will keep it as long as I live and at my death for it to go to Crit Hall a good friend of mine, and one that has stood in with me.

In regard to my property this property belongs to me I inherited it from my mother God Bless her and I intended it all for my baby James Andrew Turner but God took him home to the good world so I am all alone I intend to keep my property the longest day I live but when God calls me and I have to go then I will have no one to leave my property to but I want my home to go to Crit Hall the longest day that he lives and all I want him to do is keep it in good repair and keep

the taxes paid up and I know he will take care of my flowers. Crit has been the best friend I have had since Butch died he has been kind and befriended me many times. But at Crit's death I want my home to go direct to the Methodist Church in honor of my mother who was a devout member and Christian and my whole family who was members of the Methodist Church. I want the lot from the cross fence down to where the cross fence used to run across the lot below the Garage to be held in reserve for the benefit of my families graves on both cemeteries to keep them in good repair and have a monument put on both cemeteries for my father and mother and their family and my husband and immediate family on the Weddington Cemetery I want the graves fenced in and I want the drive way to remain as it is clear through the lot and I want Crit to rent the garages and collect the rent and have that all done and pay himself out of the rent for his trouble I want this to remain in tact as long as time shall last and at Crit's death I want the board of the Church to attend to that from where the cross fence used to run across the lower end below the garages I will give that to the Masonic Widows and Orphans Home in honor of my husband and Butch who were both faithful members of the Masonic Lodge and Bless my baby who was a mason at heart. I want the Masonic Lodge to have both houses repaired and rent them and keep the taxes always paid up and live the rest of the rent to the Home. I don't want anything done to interfere with a driveway. I want Crit to see that all my just debts are paid out of the Garage rents and the Lodge can pay Mr. Wheeler what I owe him, let him have one house to rent until he is paid then the lodge assume possession as long as time shall last never to be sold. I have never mortgaged nor sold 1 foot of my lot. Crit knows about the debts that are out and I have never got a cent from any of them. The rest on my Insurance Policy and what the Bakery was sold for and some in the Paintsville Bank Butch deposited there to pay me back on a debt.

I, intended to give Butch the lower house and lot if he had been the longest liver but he died so now I will give it to the Masonic Home.

My lot on Highland Ave was sold but I never got anything out of it.

I intended to have my lots fenced on both cemeteries and monuments put in both lots and keep the rest to live on in my old days if I should live but I don't know how Butch fixed it I sold it myself to Ballard Carter but never got anything out of it. I said I would sell my lot myself and attend to fixing the lots but if I die I want Crit to have them fixed and have them always attended to and the rest to go to Crit Hall but if I live I want it to live on in my old days, and my father and who joined the Church before he died and all my family who were members of the Methodist Church but it is all to remain my property as long as I live to rent and use as I see fit.

All of this is after I am gone and laid away.

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF ELIZABETH GOBLE

I, Elizabeth Goble of Prestonsburg, Kentucky, hereby make my last will and testament, as follows:

Item No. 1: I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid in full.

Item No. 2: I give and devise to my daughter, Belva Quisenberry, the small building which was known as the law office of my deceased husband, James Goble, and which was moved by me from its first location on Second Avenue to the lands of the heirs of James Goble and later repaired and enlarged by me. It is my hope that she will get that portion of the land where said house now stands as her part of the real estate descended to the heirs of the said James Goble but should she get some other part of said lands it is my desire and will that she remove said house thereto or make such other disposition of it that she may wish.

Item No. 3: I give and bequeath to my daughter, Elizabeth Moles, one-third (1/3) of my household goods, and effects of every kind and nature; one-third (1/3) to Mrs. Lucy Jones and one-third (1/3) to Mrs. Belva Quisenberry, my other two daughters-- said household goods and effects including but not limited to clothes furniture, books, dishes, pictures, piano, bric-a-brac, keepsakes and all my goods and chattels of all kinds in my home in Prestonsburg, Kentucky. They shall have the privilege of giving to my other children such pieces of said household goods as they may desire.

Item No. 4: I give, devise and bequeath to my three daughters, Belva Quisenberry, Lucy Jones and Elizabeth Moles, share and share alike, all the remainder of my property of every kind and nature equally, and to be divided equally among them; and this item shall include the proceeds of my life insurance and such money as I may have at the time of my death, subject, of course, to the payment of my debts and funeral expenses.

Item No. 5: My reason for omitting my sons from the benefits of this will is that their father and myself have heretofore given each of them much more than I am able to give to my daughters.

Item No. 6: I hereby appoint my daughter, Mrs. Lucy Jones as executrix of this will and request that she be permitted to qualify and act without bond. And I further request that she only include in her inventory such money as I may have and such as may be collected on my insurance above mentioned.
