LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF A. J. SHEPHERD, HANDSHOE, KY.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That I, A. J. Shepherd, of Handshoe, Floyd County, Kentucky (widower), being of full age and sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

Item I. Having heretofore disposed of most of my real estate to my children and heirs. But having retained the ownership in most of this and other property. The coal, mineral, oil, gas and other products named in the various deeds, and the rights and privileges to enter upon the lands and remove same and do all things necessary to the full use and enjoyment of the privileges. And having leased certain portions of this oil and gas to certain gas companies &c. and a number of gas and oil wells having been completed on said lands, and whereas I am receiving royalties on some and other wells being drilled on these leases from time to time, And being the owner of the royalties &c., arising from said leases &c., the purpose of this will is to dispose of these interests that I may own at the time of my death.

Item II. I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my personal property and money, if there be sufficient on hand, but at all events that this be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

Item III.
